
Historic Highlights

- ⇒ Since its founding in 2010, the FCO has grown from 30 musicians to over 145 members. FCO musicians range in age from 8 to 86.
- ⇒ Musicians commute from all across Michigan, including 15+ surrounding communities.
- \Rightarrow In 2019 the FCO unveiled its newest program, Prelude String Orchestra, demonstrating our commitment to music education for students in grades 3-8 interested in learning to play string instruments.
- \Rightarrow The FCO engaged over 5,000 community members during Season 10. In the past 10 years, over 40,000 community members enjoyed FCO offerings through concerts, events and activities.

The Orchestra was founded in August 2010 by three Fenton residents who wished to bring an orchestral experience to their community. Over the years, the FCO has served hundreds of musicians, thousands of students, and expanded its service to many local communities. A highlight of the FCO's 10th anniversary was a Special Event, "Fall in Love with the FCO", that featured many door prizes, special musical selections, and giveaways.

New Additions

In addition to the FCO's *Symphony Orchestra* and *Simply Strings*, the Board voted to have FCO acquire *Prelude String Orchestra* in the Spring 2019. This new initiative successfully engaged 28 students in Season 10. Students learned through in-person rehearsals, music education activities, and performances, as well as through a virtual COVID-19 program using Google Classroom.
