Fenton Community Orchestra

The Fenton Community Orchestra (FCO) was founded in August 2010 by three Fenton residents who wished to bring an orchestral experience to their community. The mission of the orchestra is to provide a place for musicians of all ages to connect through music by offering an educational and entertaining music program for its members and audiences.

Over the years, the FCO has served hundreds of musicians, thousands of students, and expanded its service to many local communities. With highly qualified music directors, staff and dedicated board, musician participation, audience attendance and financial support have been increasing each year. Season 9 included 150 musicians and served thousands of community members. FCO musicians range in age from 13 to 86 years old, and come from Fenton and 14+ surrounding communities.

New Additions to the FCO:

In addition to the FCO's Symphony Orchestra and Simply Strings, the Board voted to have FCO acquire Prelude String Orchestra in the Spring 2019.

Financial Highlights:

In September 2018, the FCO received a \$14,500 matching grant from the Michigan Council for Arts & Cultural Affairs and the National Endowment for the Arts to support an Operational Manager position.


In the Spring of 2019, the FCO received a \$30,000 matching grant from the Greater Flint Arts Council Share Art Genesee Grant Program.


